A Word to You From Each

HONOUR

(Scout Law No. 1)

A Scout's Honour is to be Trusted. If a Scout say 'On my honour it is so", it is so, just as if he had taken most solemn oath. Similarly, if a Leader says to a Scout, "I trust you on your honour to do this", Scout is bound to carry out the order to the very best of his ability and nothing interfere with his doing so.



ELL, I am glad that's through with! Being dyed is no fun! No fun, either, being laid out on a table almost a quarter of a mile long and having machines cut you up, and your pieces sent around to a lot of sewing machines. By the time you come together again in a shirt, or a pair of shorts, the pulling and jerking and twisting and everything you go through would ruin many a piece of cloth,-but if you can stand up to the specifications demanded by the Stores Department, you can stand anything!

"So I guess I can stand anything a Boy Scout can do to me. He can wear me on hikes over dusty roads, up rocky hills, through brush, across streams, into swamps; climbing trees, sleeping in me if he has to, leaving me on the ground (it's a poor kind of a Scout, though, that would treat me that bad!) he can do this all summer long and then let his mother put me through the washtub, wringer and the ironing board, and I'll

bet you a million dollars I will be pretty near as good as new!



The Scout Promise, made by a boy when invested as a Boy Scout, is as follows:

On my honour I promise that I will do my best-To do my duty to God and the King, To help other people at all times. To obey the Scout Law.

LOYALTY

(Scout Law No. 2)

A Scout is Loyal to the King, his country, his leaders, his parents, his employers and to those under him. He must stick to them through thick and thin against anyone who is their enemy, or who even talk badly of them.

"Yes, sir, I'll see a Scout through all the wear and tear of what he has to do, and I'll see him through troop meetings, parades, community good turns, Church attendance and everything else where he has to be dressed up. Why, I've been in this Movement since the start! Everybody knows me! The minute a Scout puts me on, he's a different Scout! Say what you will, a boy does stand a little straighter when he has me on, he certainly gets more attention; and if other fellows in the troop have Uniforms, he's mighty glad he has me to wear. His mother likes to see him dressed up in me. So do his sisters and his uncles and his aunts. If he takes good care of me I'll last him a long while. I know what I'm talking about when I say that, because I know just how I was made and how carefully I was put together.

"I hear this is going to be a great year for wearing the Uniform. It seems that every Scout who can do so is the same as a ball team: if two or three of the

going to be dressed up in honour of Lord Baden-Powell's visit. This chap Depression is swiftly loosing ground, and from all over Canada come reports indicating the return of prosperity. The idea is to get every troop fully uniformed. And for the life of me, I don't see why they shouldn't do that! We Scout Uniforms save other clothes that Scouts would have to wear if they didn't wear us,-clothes that generally cost more than I do. And the Troop or the Patrol does look so much snappier when each Scout has on the Uniform. They feel more like a real Troop or a real Patrol; more like doing things as a unit. It's just

fellows don't have a Uniform, the whole team feels sort of low-spirited.

"It makes all the difference in the world to a Scout to be in Uniform. And now that the Stores Department has arranged so that they can make me out of such good quality and sell me at such a reasonable price, you would think there wouldn't be a Scout content to be without a Uniform, no matter how much he might have to work and deny himself for a little while in order to get me. Once he gets me, he never regrets any effort he made to acquire me.

"Of course, I am the 'Official' Boy Scout Uniform. No imitation can ever take my place. When you have me, Scout, you have the right thing. You can wear me all over Canada, and all over the world for that matter, with your head up, your shoulders square. And don't forget that there is a little bit of magic in me: the minute you put me on, you are inspired to be a better Scout-ready for duty whatever happens."

HELPFULNESS

(Scout Law No. 3)

A Scout's Duty is to be Useful and to Helpothers, and he is to do his duty before everything else, even before everything else, even though he gives up his own pleasure, or comfort, or safety to do it. When in difficulty to know which of two things to do, he must ask himself, "Which is my duty?"—that is, "Which is the best for other people?" duty?—that is, Which is the best for other people?" and do that one. He must Be Prepared at any time to save life, or to help injured persons and must try his best to do a good turn to somebody every day.

FRIENDLINESS

(Scout Law No. 4)

A Scout is a Friend to All, and a Brother to Every Other Scout, no matter to what Social Class the other Belongs. Class the other Belongs. Thus, if a Scout meets another Scout, even though a stranger to him, he must speak to him, and help him in any way that he can, either to carry out the duty he is then doing, or by giving him food, or, as far as consible anything that as possible, anything that he may be in want of. A Scout must never be a Snob.

CHIVALRY

(Scout Law No. 5)

A Scout is Courteous: That is, he is polite to all -but especially to women and children and old people and invalids, cripples, etc., and he must not take any reward for being helpful or courteous.

AY! to listen to that Uniform chap you would think that he represented the whole of the Association. Everybody knows and appreciates the fact that the Uniform is the outward and visible sign of a Boy Scout, that it's made of the finest of materials, that it can be purchased at a reasonable cost and that it does save wear and tear on other clothes and is economy in the end—But! what about Equipment? Well, all we can say is that we are almost as necessary as a Uniform. In fact more so at times. And what an array of uses we are put to. Every boy knows how valuable the different items of Equipment are, how handy he finds the Scout Axe, the Woodcraft Knife, Rucksack, First Aid Kit, Flashlight etc., etc. Perhaps we had better not say any more;—except this: Look us over!"

A Word from the Books

CHEERFULNESS

(Scout Law No. 8)

A Scout Smiles and Whistles under all Difficulties. When he gets an order he should obey it cheerily and readily, not in a slow, hang-dog sort of way. Scouts never grouse at hardships, nor whine at each other nor swear when

each other, nor swear when put out, but go on whistling and smiling. Under any annoying circumstances you

should force yourself to smile at once and then whistle a tune and you will be all right.

"It's all very well for those Uniform and Equipment fellows having so much to say, but we really think that something should be said about Books. Everybody agrees that we seldom get paraded before the public, but we venture to predict that we are in just as large a demand as those other fellows. A Uniform might put one of us in his pocket or we may find ourselves occasionally nestling in a Haversack, but this is only because the Scout wants us for ready reference. Some of us have been on hikes, many of us at camps, and we're always present at Troop Headquarters. Our friend the 1935 Diary is already in hundreds of Scout and Cub pockets and our newest addition The Boy Scout and Wolf Cub Proficiency Badge Reference Book is going to be found everywhere.

Yes, we agree with the other fellows, but we're here to say that we play a mighty important part in Scouting too."

THRIFT

(Seout Law No. 9)
A Scout is Thrifty,
that is, he saves every
penny he can and puts
it into the bank so
that he may have
money to keep himself
when out of work and
thus not make himself
a burden to others, or
that he may have
money to give away to
others when they
need it.

(Scout Law No. 10)

A Scout is Clean in Thought, Word and Deed, that is, he looks down upon a silly youth who talks dirt, and he does not let himself give way to temptation either to talk it, or to think or do anything dirty. A Scout is pure and clean-minded and manly.

OBEDIENCE (Scout Law No. 7)

A Scout Obeys Orders of his parents, patrol leader, or Scoutmaster without question. Even if he gets an order he does not like he must do as soldiers and sailors do—he must carry it out all the same because it is his duty, and after he has done it he can come and state any reasons against it, but he must carry out the order at once. That is discipline.

KINDNESS

(Scout Law No. 6)

A Scout is a Friend to Animals. He should save them as far as possible from pain, and should not kill any animal unnecessarily, for it is one of God's creatures. Killing an animal for food or an animal which is harmful, is allowable.



The Wolf Cub Promise, made by a boy when invested as a Wolf Cub is as follows:—

I promise to do my best—
To do my duty to God
and the King,
To keep the Law of the
Wolf Cub Pack, and to
do a good turn to somebody every day.

"After listening to the Uniform, Equipment and Book fellows it does appear in order that we should say just a few words. We lay claim to the achievement side of Scouting; we are the designators of its several ranks, the progress made in proficiency badge tests and the thanks of Boy Scouts to others for their 'Good Turns.' You should see how carefully the Quartermaster keeps us at Headquarters. And say! isn't he strict about where he sends us. Sometimes a Scoutmaster or Cubmaster will include us in an order with those Equipment and Uniform fellows, but we're never sent out in the same parcel. No, Sir! If you

want to order us you'll have to send to your Provincial Headquarters, for no Badge or Insignia orders are filled at the Dominion office. Who wants to be wrapped up with those big fellows! We're too important for that!"

The word "uniform" means having the same form or manner, in other words, all alike. The Cub uniform differs from that of the Scout as will be readily seen by the above illustration. Like their elder brothers, the Boy Scouts, Cubs are very proud of their uniform and none look smarter when properly and correctly attired. It is, however, most important to the regard in which Cubs shall be held by the general public, that their uniform, like their conduct, should be orderly. Appearance in varied nondescript outfits creates an unfavourable impression upon other boys who desire to become Cubs. Every effort, therefore, should be made toward having Cubs neatly and correctly uniformed.


"Ship Later" Notices

NOTES FOR BADGE EXAMINERS

BOY SCOUT BADGES:—The Proficiency Badges are an aid to character training and to the development of those qualities of good citizenship. They offer the boy incentives for progressing along the lines suggested by his own tastes and abilities.

To gain the Badge, a Scout must satisfy at least one independent and qualified examiner who has been duly approved of. The conditions laid down for each Badge in P.O.R. are intended for the guidance of Examiners so that they may know what ground the boy may legitimately be expected to have covered.

These Proficiency badges fall roughly into three classes:

- (a) Handicrafts and Hobbies such as Carpenter and Leatherworker.
- (b) Service, such as Ambulance and Pathfinder.
- (c) Scouting, such as Camper and Tracker.

The first group encourages the right use of leisure; the second promotes good citizenship, and the third provides an incentive to advanced out-door activities.

THE USE:—It is recognized that the wearing of a Proficiency badge does not indicate that the wearer is an expert in that subject, but what knowledge he has should be sound according to his age and ability. It is important that the knowledge should be kept up and not allowed to rust by disuse.

The value of these badges for character training may be indicated as follows:-

- They provide an outlet for the boy's desire for, and sense
 of, creation. By utilising the badge system he is able
 actually to produce something of a required standard.
 The knowledge of being able to do something on one's own
 is one of the most strengthening forces we have.
- They give him useful pleasures which may develop into lifelong hobbies.
- They provide a ready means of encouraging the dull or backward boy, by giving such a wide range of subjects that he is able to find at least one at which he can make a good show and so retain his self-respect and gain confidence.

The Service Badges are an important element in the Movement's training for Service to others and as such necessitate some degree of practical efficiency in being able to render this service.

THE STANDARD:—It will be seen from the foregoing that in the case of hobby and handicraft badges, it is unnecessary and even undesirable to lay down any fixed standard. For the same reason the requirements for the badges are purposely laid down in wide and elastic terms. What would be a very creditable performance in a boy of indifferent mentality would be exceedingly poor in the case of his more gifted and fortunate brother. The standard therefore must be that of effort made, rather than of proficiency shown. This is only reasonable to compensate for the differences in age and opportunity.

The case of Service badges is somewhat different insomuch as the standard, to be effective, must be a sound one. For instance, a boy's knowledge of Ambulance must be practical and thorough, as judged by recognized authorities, if he is to be of adequate assistance in time of need. The same applies to the Rescuer's badge, or the Fireman's. It will be found that in all cases of Service badges this is recognised, and the requirements of the badge are more specific for that reason.

EXAMINING:—Bearing in mind the foregoing, the examiner will find his task immensely interesting and far simpler than he may imagine.

The atmosphere should be that of an informal talk between two people interested in the same subject and, as far as possible, the feeling of examination strain should be avoided but, on the other hand, it must be remembered that boys like doing practical things and, as far as possible, the candidate should be asked to give a practical demonstration. The examiner should be conversant with the requirements for the tests before the Scout arrives, so that constant reference to the book of rules is unnecessary.

It should be remembered that the boy is almost sure to be shy and nervous unless he knows the examiner beforehand, and it is well to establish friendly relations and confidence at the start by asking him a few questions about himself and what badges he already holds. He should always be asked to say how long he has studied his subject and whether he has attended classes, worked on his own or gained his knowledge through actual practice, as his answers will give a clue to the amount of effort he has made and the amount of interest he takes.

A few questions on the badge subject will quickly show whether he is sufficiently interested and informed to deserve the badge. As far as possible he should be asked to demonstrate the practical application of what he has learnt and in making a decision, his education, age and opportunity of learning should be borne in mind.

It should be remembered that generally the boy has taken a lot of trouble to work up for his badge and he will, therefore, appreciate a thorough test, so long as the scope of the syllabus is not exceeded.

Examiners are earnestly requested to teach the boys as much as they have time for during the tests. If a boy is well up to the work, he will delight in being led on with advice in regard to further study, both theoretical and practical, books to read, etc., since the winning of the badge is not the final aim, but only a milestone on his journey.

On the other hand, if the boy has not studied his subject sufficiently, he should be told where he is weak and given as much information as time will allow. Encouragement will go a long way in helping him to continue working, for a boy may easily have his ardour dampened by failure to pass, and if the examiner can fix a definite date for his re-examination, there is every chance of the boy sticking to it.

In cases where the examiner is uncertain whether to pass or fail, a reference to the boy's Scoutmaster will often help his decision.

Whether the boy is passed or failed, the examiner is asked to notify the fact on the form which is either sent to him or brought by the boy, and if a date for further examination has been fixed it should be so stated. The Scoutmaster can, by this means, see that the appointment is kept.

WOLF CUB BADGES:—In examining Wolf Cubs it should be remembered that the boys are younger than Scouts, and that the syllabus is accordingly less elaborate and even more practical. The younger boys are more nervous and incoherent and it is therefore necessary that the examiner should have an understanding of the small boy's mind as well as of the test.

Examiners should encourage the production of a letter from the Cubmaster giving any information as to the boy's difficulties, whether he is quick or slow, etc., and should remember that the test of effort made, rather than proficiency, is even more important with Cubs than Scouts.

It is therefore wise to ascertain not only whether the boy knows how, but also whether he has in fact been practising regularly. This particularly applies to "home" tests such as cleaning boots, physical exercises, etc.

The recommendation given above that examiners should try to extend the Scout's knowledge requires qualification in the case of Wolf Cubs, as it is important that they should not encroach on the Scout standards of any particular subject before they join the Scout section. Instead it is advisable to impress upon the boy the importance of keeping on practising in the work he has already done.
