
Winter Camp at the Jensen

Crawford Lake Conservation Area

Crawford Lake Conservation Area is one of seven conservation areas operated by Conservation Halton, but the only one to an offer All-Terrain Wheelchair Program. The conservation area has four chairs, two suitable for children (or small adults) and two for adults. The chairs can be reserved ahead of time, or else they are on a first come first serve basis. Not all of the trails are suitable for the chairs, so plan your hike ahead of time. The chairs are offered free of charge to the general public.

The conservation area also has a reconstructed 15th Iroquoian Village and a Hide and Seek Trail with larger than life wooden sculptures of Birds, Butterflies, Amphibians and Turtles.

Keeping It Fresh, Engaging and Fun

SNOWBALL FIGHTS! Conducted indoors are a lot of FUN!

Ok, before you think me mad or consider this idea as a great way of breaking your lease with your church or school, let me put this into prospective. First of all the whole idea comes from being a guest presenter of this magazine at the ViEW or Venturer / Rover "Expedition Leader" Workshop on November 20th at Camp Samac in Oshawa, Ontario. They get all the credit if this works for you and I'll take all the blame if you lose your lease.

This was the most fun our company ever had planning.

The process:

- 1. Have each member write on idea on a piece of paper (or two or more pieces depending on the number of people)
- 2. Then tell them to crunch up each piece of paper into a ball
- 3. Tell them to let them fly
- 4. After a few minutes, ask the members to pick up the snowballs (equal number per person)
- 5. Each person one at a time un-crumples a snowball and reads the idea aloud
- 6. The person reading the idea has to indicate whether it's a short, medium or long term in respect to planning
- 7. Allow a minute or two to discuss the idea, then move on to another snowball
- 8. Keep a list of the ideas presented

Our president ran the process without letting the rest of the company know in advance what was happening. They loved the snowball fight of course but also trying to guess whose idea each one was. Some were obvious and others gave us an insight into the interests of individual members.

Romanian Explorer Belt – Explorer/Network Scout July 13 – 27, 2017

This opportunity offers the chance to take part in a 10-day Explorer Belt expedition that brings you a real understanding of a different country, its culture and way of life. You will develop this understanding by travelling through your chosen country, working as part of a small team to complete a series of projects and most importantly by meeting local people. The minimum travelling time will be 50 hours over the 10 days by foot, cycle, horse, canoe, boat or dinghy. It is an experience and an achievement that you will remember for the rest of your life.

Transylvania is the forgotten jewel in Romania's crown and is one of the most important and natural and cultural landscapes. The region is made up of a mosaic of unspoiled traditional villages and fortified medieval churches. The city of Brasov with its fairy-tale turrets and cobbled streets will be our starting point with the chance to look around the city prior to leaving on the expedition itself. Of course the most famous castle of all belongs to Dracula, just a few miles away.

We will end at Brasov before transferring back to the capital Bucharest for an overnight stay and then on home to Glasgow.

Editor's Note:

The content above was taken from the Scouts Scotland website. European Scouting has a tradition of providing a capping adventure to its Venturer Scout & Rover Scout/Network Scout programmes. Selected representatives train a year ahead to take a 10 day expedition in a foreign country. Upon completion of the journey and review of the members' log, successful participants are awarded a Belt Bucket to signify their accomplishment.

Currently Canadian Scouting's only comparable award is the Amory Award for Venturer Scouts. Rovering has largely settled on the weekend stationary car camping "Moot". In contrast a large part of the Explorer Belt experience is the interaction with the public through local activities and service over a 10 day period. **Our challenge is offer our members a more varied programme with greater challenge.**



We welcome our Guide and Scout friends from around the world. They will have a unique camp experience, because during the summer weeks, the sun never sets and the scouts can enjoy activities day and night.

ROVERS

Have you stayed up all night at camp before? You will get a chance to do that at Nord 2017 as well. Maybe you just want to sleep all day? It's up to you. Whatever you choose, welcome to the rover camp Døgnvill.

There will be activities such as rover cafe with entertainment and campfires. There will of course also be an overnight hike for the rovers. What and where is yet to be decided, but there will be something to suit everyone.

In the rover camp everything will be a bit more relaxed. You'll decide yourself when to go to sleep and get up. In general you will be freer to do what you like. Rovers will also be able to exit and enter the jamboree site to a larger degree than the scouts.
