As Baden-Powell said, keeping a pet is a good way of getting to know and understand the ways of birds and animals. To assist you with this, we suggest the following:


- (1) Check with your mother and dad to gain their help in looking after your pet.

- (3) Find out if you have a humane society in your community. If so, call or visit the society. You will be welcomed and will receive good advice and literature about caring for pets.


We hope that you will have lots of fun with your pet.

TRAIN Your dog


TO LIE DOWN




START WITH CARTON

ALITTLE PAINT WORKS WONDERS MAKE IT BRIGHT. LETTER HIS NAME ON SIDE






IF FISH SEEMS SICK, REMOVE









EGGS OF A RED KING SNAKE









PARTS OF A "BUDGY"


RAISING CRICKETS
